√	Questions with Do/Does	Ask about routines	<i>Do you play football? / Does she watch TV? / Do they go shopping on Sundays?</i>
^	Like / Love / Hate + Verb-ing	Talk about preferences	<i>I like reading. / She loves cooking. / He hates doing homework. / They love dancing.</i>
^	Modal verb Can / Can't	Express ability or permission	<i>I can swim. / He can't drive. / Can you play the guitar? / She can speak English.</i>
^	Adverbs of Frequency	How often actions happen	<i>I usually go jogging in the morning. / She sometimes watches TV. / They always play football on Saturday.</i>
^	Present Continuous	Actions happening now	<i>She is painting a picture. / I am writing a letter. / They are playing football now. / He is listening to music.</i>
9	There is / There are	Describe existence / quantity	<i>There is a hotel near the station. / There are two buses today. / Is there a bank nearby? / There aren't any apples in the fridge.</i>
9	Prepositions of Place	Show position or direction	<i>Walk towards the station. / We are sitting outside. / The keys are on the table. / The bag is under the chair.</i>
9	Imperatives / Suggestions	Instructions or invitations	<i>Let's go to the park. / Open the window. / Don't run in the classroom. / Take a pen.</i>
9	Countable / Uncountable Nouns	Basic distinction	<i>I need some money. / I have two tickets. / She bought three apples. / We need some water.</i>

√-9	Negatives	Use don't / doesn't / can't	<i>I don't like horror movies. / She can't drive. / They don't eat meat. / He doesn't watch TV in the morning.</i>
√-9	Basic Question Formation	Form yes/no questions	<i>Do you like pizza? / Can you swim? / Does she play football? / Do they go shopping on Saturdays?</i>
